THE BOOK OF ACTS Acts Chapter 1



Over 10 weeks Quiz Worx Home Delivery is exploring the Book Of Acts.

Acts is the second volume of Jesus' ministry, as recorded by the historian Luke.

Jesus' earthly ministry is recorded in the gospel of Luke up until the time of Jesus' death and resurrection. The second volume, which we call "Acts", continues to record the ministry of Jesus. Yet that ministry is now done through his people, by the power of the Holy Spirit (see Acts 1:1-8).

Acts 1:8 sets the focus of the book. Through the power of the Holy Spirit the apostles (and those who would follow their teaching) were to be witnesses of Jesus, starting in Jerusalem, but then moving beyond that to Judea, Samaria, and ultimately to the ends of the earth.

The teaching of the book of Acts is that through his death and resurrection, Jesus is the person whom God has appointed as king of his kingdom. Jesus is the Risen King! And he has a mission. Jesus' mission is that people from all around the world would hear that Jesus is the king. And Jesus' mission is that people from all around the world would accept Jesus as their king.

Through our weekly Kids' Talk videos we will look at how Jesus' mission began to spread despite the things and people who tried to stop it. Each Kids' Talk video has accompanying discussion questions for you to work through with your children.

We have also provided some further 'Digging Deeper' Family devotions. These will help you and your family work through the book of Acts and discover more about Jesus' mission as carried out by his people, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

We realise that the book of Acts is a long book - 28 chapters in all. As such, there will be some parts of the book that will not be directly looked at in either the Kids' talks or the 'Digging Deeper' Family Devotions. If you and your family wish to read through these extra sections, then please feel free to do so!

As we journey through Acts together, we are going to see again and again that the mission of the Risen King Jesus cannot be stopped.

Let's pray that we can be part of Jesus' unstoppable mission.

Discussion Questions after Acts 1 Video

This talk introduces us to the main idea of the book of Acts. Just as God had planned from the beginning of time, Jesus is now the Risen King. He has beaten death, appeared to his followers, and now he commands them to continue his mission.

- 1. Can you remember what Jesus' mission is? (For people from all around the world to hear that Jesus is the king and for people from all around the world to accept Jesus as their king)
- 2. How do we know that Jesus' mission can't be stopped?
- **3.** How can you be part of Jesus' unstoppable mission? Who can you tell about the Risen King Jesus?

Thank God that Jesus is the Risen King and nothing can stop his mission. Ask God to help us tell others about Jesus.

How to use 'Digging Deeper' for the Book of Acts.

To help you in your journey through Acts, each week we will provide three devotions. We encourage you to read these passages with those in your household at a time that suits, and use the questions to guide you as you talk and reflect on Jesus' unstoppable mission in the book of Acts.

We looked at a number of different Bible translations when creating these questions. So feel free to use any version as you work through them with your family.

Something to remember

As we journey through the Book of Acts, we will continue to see that the mission of the Risen King Jesus cannot be stopped.

As you look at each passage, keep asking:

- a) What could stop Jesus' mission?
- b) How do we see these obstacles overcome?
- c) How can I be part of Jesus' unstoppable mission?

Devotion 1- Acts 1:1-2

The author of the Book of Acts is Luke. He also wrote the Gospel of Luke. In Acts 1:1 Luke tells Theophilus (the man he was writing to) that his first book was about "all that Jesus *began* to do and to teach" (NIV).

- 1. Spend some time brainstorming things that Jesus did when he lived here on earth. When you have your list, see if you can find some of the actual Bible references in the Book of Luke.
- **2.** Which one of the things Jesus did and taught when he lived on earth amazes you most? Why?
- **3.** Jesus left earth to go back to heaven after giving his apostles instructions (v2). What do you think these instructions might have been?

Pray

Thank God for sending Jesus to earth to show us what God is like.

Devotion 2- Acts 1:3-11

The Good News of the Bible is that Jesus died on the cross for our sins. But he didn't stay dead. Jesus beat death! Jesus is the risen King!

- 1. How did Jesus prove that he had risen from the dead? (You might also like to read Luke chapter 24)
- **2.** Jesus promises to send his disciples a special gift. Who is the gift? How will this gift help them?
- **3.** Acts 1:8 is a key verse for the entire Book of Acts. The disciples will be given power by the Holy Spirit (God living inside them!) to tell people about the risen King Jesus! As a family, write this verse out and stick it somewhere in your house so you can read it each day (make it as big and decorative as you can!)

Pray

Thank God that Jesus beat death and is now the risen King, ruling from heaven.

Thank God for the gift of the Holy Spirit who helps us tell others about Jesus.

Pray for some of the people or places you have written in your Mission Diary (see craft ideas).

Devotion 3- Acts 1:12-26 (If you have younger children, just read 1:15-22)

Followers of Jesus have a personal relationship with the God of the universe. Part of that means that we can and should pray to God.

- 1. What do you notice about the way the apostles pray?
- 2. What was the criteria for choosing someone to replace Judas?
- **3.** Do you seek God in prayer over the decisions you make personally and as a family? How can you encourage each other to do that more?

Pray

Thank God that we can talk to him anytime, anywhere about anything.

Ask God to help you seek him in prayer always.
