Discussion Questions after 'The Greatest Swap in History (Part 1)' Kid's Talk

- 1. Have you ever swapped something with someone else? Maybe trading cards, an icecream, your lunch, a bike? Have you ever wished that someone could swap places with you?
- **2.** Think back to the picture of the man on the cross next to Jesus who had done lots of wrong things. What did Jesus do for him? What did Jesus do for all people when he died on the cross?
- **3.** How does it make you feel to know that Jesus swapped his innocence for our guilt by taking all the wrong things we do onto himself?

Thank God that Jesus was perfect. He always obeyed his heavenly Father & he never sinned.

Thank God that Jesus swapped his innocence for our guilt so we can be forgiven and be friends with God.

Digging Deeper





How to use 'Digging Deeper' for the 'The Greatest Swap in History' videos.

To help you think more about the greatest swap in history, we have provided three devotions for our Good Friday video & three devotions for our Easter Sunday video.

We encourage you to read these passages with those in your household at a time that suits and use the questions to guide you as you talk about and reflect on Jesus this Easter.

Devotion 1 – Read Luke 23:1-15 & verses 23-25

In this passage, Jesus is brought before the Roman Governor, Pilate and King Herod. He was accused of many things but neither Pilate or Herod found him guilty of any crime...

- 1. What was Jesus being accused of?
- **2.** How did Jesus respond to the accusations against him? How did Pilate & Herod respond to Jesus?
- **3.** How does it make you feel that Pilate & Herod allowed Jesus to be killed even though they knew he was innocent of any crime?

Pray

Thank God that even in the face of many accusations, Jesus did not sin.

Say sorry to God for the ways you have turned against Jesus, not treating him the way he deserves to be treated.

Devotion 2 – Read Luke 23:32-43

Here we read that Jesus was put on a cross even though he was completely innocent. Next to him was a man who was anything but innocent. An amazing swap occurs...

- **1.** Read Jesus' words again in verse 34. What is Jesus asking? Why do you think he asks this?
- **2.** Compare how the soldiers and the two criminals respond to Jesus? Who truly knew who Jesus was?
- **3.** One of the criminals knew that Jesus was innocent. What does Jesus promise him in verse 43? How does Jesus fulfil this promise? (HINT: it's the first part of the greatest swap in history!)

Pray

Thank God that this man on the cross knew who Jesus was and trusted him.

Thank God that Jesus forgave this man and took his sin onto himself when he died on the cross, so that this man could be forgiven and become friends with God.

Thank God that this swap was not just for this man, but for everyone who trusts Jesus.

Family Devotions

Devotion 3 – Read Luke 23: 44-56

In this passage, we read about the terrible event on the first Good Friday, where Jesus Christ, the Son of God died on the cross. But this was all part of God's plan for Jesus to make the greatest swap in history...

- 1. How do we know that Jesus really died?
- 2. How do the different people mentioned in the passage respond to Jesus' death?
- **3.** Why did Jesus have to die? How does it make you feel that Jesus really died on the cross?

Pray

Spend time saying sorry to God for the ways that you have not listened and obeyed him.

Thank God that Jesus died on the cross to take the punishment that you deserve, so you can be forgiven.

Are there people in your life that need to know about this great swap? Pray for them and ask God for opportunities to tell them about Jesus this Easter. Maybe you could ask them to watch this video with you!
